RE: Enrollment and funding changes for high school students taking college courses at SCC

Recent legislative action has resulted in the following changes to NCCCS' 'Community College Joint High School Programs':

The General Assembly eliminated funding for General Education (excluding math, science, and technology), physical education, and college success skills courses offered to high school students through the Huskins (T90970), Dual Enrollment (T90980), and LEARN & EARN Online (T90920) programs.

Huskins, Dual, and LEARN & EARN students may no longer enroll tuition-free in courses with these prefixes: ACA, ANT, ARA, ART, ASL, CHI, COM, DAN, DRA, ECO, ENG, FRE, GEO, GER, HIS, HUM, ITA, JPN, LAT, MUS, PED, PHI, POL, POR, PSY, RED, REL, RUS, SOC, and SPA.

Huskins, Dual, and LEARN & EARN students may continue to enroll tuition-free in ALL other courses including math, science, health, and technology. All approved courses will continue to be tuition exempt. Huskins, Dual, and LEARN & EARN students must purchase their own textbooks and materials. The state will no longer provide funding to reimburse public schools for LEARN & Earn textbooks.

High school students may enroll in courses from the restricted list on a 'self-supporting' basis. This means that students would be responsible for paying for the 'cost of the course'. This enrollment can only be done during the drop/add period on a space available basis. Per regulations outlined in 23 NC 2C.0305, high school students may not displace adult students and cannot pre-registered for these self-pay courses.

The changes effecting Huskins, Dual, and LEARN & EARN students do not impact Early College High School (T90930) students.
