#### **PREAMBLE**

The University of North Carolina at Greensboro (UNCG) and Community Colleges with AAS degrees in Early Childhood, in their continuing efforts to serve educational needs of the State of North Carolina and its citizenry, and to work collegially with sister institutions to improve access to higher education for the benefit of the entire State, do hereby commit to this Articulation Agreement.

This Articulation Agreement pertains to those students earning the Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) in Early Childhood Associate who seek to complete the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) Degree in Human Development and Family Studies, Early Care and Education, Option I - A: Non-Licensure or Option I - B: B-K Licensure at UNCG.

Based on the most recent changes made to the AAS degree core requirements in Early Childhood in the Fall of 2005, the common core components of both options are as follows:

- All Community College graduates with an AAS in Early Childhood will be admitted as candidates for the articulation program in Human Development and Family Studies, Option I - A: Non-Licensure, Early Care and Education and Option I - B: B-K Licensure in Preschool Education if they complete the A.A.S. in Early Childhood within the five years preceding the date of desired admittance with an overall 2.0 GPA. Content area from the A.A.S. not graded above 'C-' cannot transfer and will not fulfill content area at UNCG.
- All CC graduates will enter UNCG with 64 semester hours of credit depending upon successful completion of community college coursework with C- grades or higher. This block of credit hours does not fulfill content areas in majors other than HDF Options I – A or I – B.
- Based on the satisfaction of the above terms CC graduates will have a
  maximum of 64-65 semester hours remaining for degree completion. A
  minimum of 31 semester hours must be taken and completed in residency at
  UNCG, 12 of which must be in the major.
- 4. The Articulation Agreement students must meet the same admission standards as all other UNCG students for official admission to the Department of Human Development and Family Studies -- Early Care and Education Concentration. Admission is based on a minimum UNCG GPA of a 2.2 for at least 12 semester hours. For B-K Licensure, a minimum UNCG GPA of 2.5 is required.
- 5. This agreement shall run continuously without necessity of renewal. By August 1 of each year community colleges will provide UNCG any changes in the Early Childhood Associate curriculum for annual review. If the courses listed in the Addendum to this agreement are changed, the parties will review those changes and if acceptable a new Addendum reflecting those changes may be substituted for the existing Addendum without need for further negotiation or modification of this agreement. If the changes are not acceptable to either party, this agreement may be renegotiated or terminated.
- 6. This agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice. In the event of termination, students who have matriculated at UNCG will be continued through completion of the Baccalaureate Degree. Also, CC students enrolled at the time who declare in writing to UNCG, within 30 days of written notice by CC of the termination, that they are pursuing this

Articulation Agreement will be continued through completion of the Baccalaureate Degree.

7. Both UNCG and CC give mutual assurance that in performing their duties under this agreement, they will not discriminate on the basis of race, religion, sex, national origin, age, and handicap. Reasonable accommodations for participation by disabled persons will be made in compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.

It is with great dedication to the citizenry of the State of North Carolina that The University of North Carolina at Greensboro and the Community College System agree in October 2006 to establish the Articulation Agreement outlined herein regarding Community College Students who are pursuing the Bachelor of Science Degree in Human Development and Family Studies, Preschool Education Concentration at The University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

#### EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION ARTICULATION AGREEMENT between THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA WILMINGTON and THE NORTH CAROLINA COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM

The University of North Carolina Wilmington (UNCW) agrees to accept college transfer coursework completed at North Carolina community colleges in accordance with UNCW's policy on transfer credit as published in the UNCW Undergraduate Catalogue. Community colleges participating in this articulation agree to ensure that instructors hold appropriate credentials. Community college students who complete the associate of applied science degree (AAS) in Early Childhood Education in May 2006 or later, and comply with the terms and conditions of this agreement, including those stipulated in the addendum to this agreement, will be considered admissible to UNCW for the purpose of pursuing the Bachelor of Arts degree in the Education of Young Children in the Watson School of Education.

The parties further agree that the recipient of an AAS degree in Early Childhood Education from a North Carolina community college, with at least a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 based on a 4.0 scale, will be admitted to UNCW at junior level standing provided all other conditions for admission are satisfied and that an application for admission is received within three (3) years of the awarding of the AAS degree. No more than 64 semester credit hours may be transferred from the community college to UNCW. Transfer students must satisfy UNCW's Basic Studies and other degree requirements prior to the awarding of the Bachelor's Degree unless specified otherwise in this agreement and its addendum.

Admission to the university does not constitute admission to a professional school or specific program. Students admitted to UNCW under this articulation agreement will lose transfer credit and other benefits particular to this agreement should they change majors. Students may graduate under the provisions of the UNCW Undergraduate Catalogue in effect at the time of their matriculation at UNCW or any subsequent catalogue, providing all graduation requirements are completed within eight (8) years of the expiration date of the catalogue chosen.

This agreement shall be effective on the date it is signed by both parties and may be extended or amended by the mutual agreement of both parties. Further, this agreement may be voided by either party with six months prior notice.

#### ADDENDUM

to

The Articulation Agreement Between

The North Carolina Community College System and University of North Carolina Wilmington Governing the Transfer of Students Earning the Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree in Early Childhood Education

and Leading to the Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree in the Education of Young Children (EYC) at University of North Carolina Wilmington

I. The following courses, which are taken by community college students to fulfill requirements for the AAS degree in Early Childhood Education, are equivalent to the University of North Carolina at Wilmington (UNCW) courses listed. Students will receive transfer credit for these courses provided they earn a grade of 'C' or better in each. Advisors at community colleges will assist students in selecting electives that meet requirements for both the Early Childhood Education AAS and Basic Studies<sup>a</sup> curricula at UNCW.

Students who enter UNCW under the articulation agreement will receive credit for these UNCW courses provided they earn a grade of 'C' or better in each community college course.

III. Community college students must choose 18 or 19 hours\* of additional courses from the following selections, which are equivalent to the UNCW courses listed, in order to enter UNCW with 60 or 61\* hours remaining for the Bachelor of Arts degree. Students will receive transfer credit for these courses provided they earn a grade of 'C' or better in each. Advisors at community colleges will assist students in selecting electives that meet requirements for both the Early Childhood Education AAS and Basic Studies<sup>a</sup> curricula at UNCW.

IV. The following courses, which are taken by community college students to fulfill requirements for the Early Childhood Education AAS as a "block" of courses, should fulfill required content for the UNCW courses listed and will transfer only as a "block". Students who enter UNCW under the articulation agreement will receive 15 hours of Education Elective (EDN 001) credit for the following block of community college courses provided they earn a grade of 'C' or better in each community college course: COE 111, EDU 131, EDU 145 or PSY 245, EDU 146, EDU 271, EDU 280. This allows the articulating student to receive credit for all 64 community college hours being credited at UNCW, upon entry to UNCW as a transfer student.

When conditions A, B, and C below are satisfied, the UNCW courses listed in C below will be matched to the above elective courses on the student's degree audit.

- A. Completion of BIO 160 (or equivalent), EDN 200 & EDNL 200 (or equivalent), EDN 302, EDN 383, EDN 386, EDN 387, EDN 430, EDN 450, EDN 451, EDN 460, NSG 345, NSGL 345, PED 350, SOC 349 or SOC 345 (or equivalent), and SWK 311 with a grade of "C" or better at UNCW or other regionally accredited higher education institution.
- B. Admission to the teacher education program in the Watson School of Education and an overall GPA of 2.7 on all courses completed at UNCW prior to the internship semester.
- C. Demonstrated competency in the content and skills covered by the following courses, according to criteria set by the Watson School of Education: EDN 303, EDN 382, EDN 385, EDN 424, EDN 463 and PSY 320.
