- 23. To improve the quality of the program, I recommend the following:
 - *The program was great.
 - *I would love to see a part-time or full-time PTA on the staff to help out.
 - *Remove some of the non-program courses. Offer students option to test out of some courses to lessen load on students in the PTA program.
 - *Increasing the # of hours of observations (indecipherable) entering the program to the students clinical knowledge.
 - *Hire a PTA who can be available to lead hands-on lab time & provide one-on-one instruction. Current staff level was too busy to provide adequate instruction in lab- particularly the area of manual therapy.
 - *More lab time and more focus on manual therapy particularly joint mobs and positioning.
 - *I feel the program is highly outpatient focused on modalities and some acute care skills are necessary...i.e. learning about lab values: how they affect treatment.
