


**Articulation Agreement between Southwestern Community College and Western Carolina University for transfer of credit from the A.A.S. Culinary Technology degree into the Bachelors of Science in Hospitality and Tourism degree at WCU.**


- A. Students will be admitted as candidates for the articulation program in hospitality management upon the completion of the A.A.S. in culinary technology.
- B. Students applying under this articulation agreement must meet the same admission standards as all other WCU students for entrance into the hospitality and tourism program.
- C. Students can earn additional semester hours of transfer credit by completing general education and program requirement courses. Students who complete the 44-hour general education core of courses approved in the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement in 1997 will have WCU liberal studies requirements waived. All courses must be completed with a "C" or higher grade.
- D. To graduate from Western with a hospitality and tourism degree all students must complete a minimum of 32 semester hours of upper level Western course credit, including a minimum of 12 hours in the major field as described in the attached course equivalency outline.
- E. This agreement will run continually without need for renewal. Copies of this agreement will be distributed to the deans and department heads by February 1 of each year. Any updates to this agreement should be submitted by March 15. If curriculum changes occur in any of the courses identified in this agreement, parties from both institutions will review the changes and update the course equivalency outline.
- F. Either party upon written notice can terminate this agreement. If the agreement is terminated, students who have matriculated at WCU can continue until completion of the baccalaureate degree if they are continuously enrolled at Western. Also, students who are enrolled at the time may continue under the terms of the agreement as long as they are continuously enrolled. If the student ceases enrollment for two regular academic semesters, he/she must re-enroll under the most recently adopted agreement.


