ETSU was founded in 1911 as East Tennessee State Normal School and then changed to East Tennessee Teachers College in 1925. After a couple other name changes, East Tennessee State University was official in 1963. ETSU has over 15,000 undergraduate, graduate and professional students . The university is located in Johnson City, Tennessee which has a population of 61,990.


Summer Institute 2015
