- Feedback on the Course Readiness Review from Faculty:
 - Can the course schedule requirement be met by using the due dates features for assignments because the course calendar in Moodle will show dots on the dates that something is due?
- We have been asked to look at persistence in Online Courses, and develop a proposal for improvement in this area. We need to define:
 - O Timeframe:
 - It does not need to be accomplished this year, but an action plan needs to be developed pragmatically before the end of the Spring term
 - Challenge:
 - The team will identify an intervention which could increase persistence in online courses here at SCC
 - This intervention should be based in research and data
 - Equity Mindset:
 - Our approaches need to ensure that outcomes improve and become or continue to be equitable across demographic groups.
 - Engagement and Decision Making Process:
 - We may need to communicate with other college stakeholders through channels such as open meetings, email updates, and updates to key governance committees.
 - Funding:
 - The group should work under the assumption that there is no new funding and funds necessary to implement would come through the annual planning and budgeting cycle and/or reprioritization of existing resources.
