
Social & Human Services - Addiction and Recovery Studies - Health Sciences











ABOUT THIS FIELD

The Addiction & Recovery Pathway within the Social and Human Services program prepares students to support individuals, families, and communities affected by substance use and co-occurring mental health conditions. This pathway is ideal for students interested in careers in substance use treatment, recovery support services, prevention programs, case management, or as preparation for further education in addiction counseling, social work, or behavioral health.



WHAT YOU'LL STUDY

Coursework in the Addiction & Recovery Pathway focuses on the science of addiction, ethical practice, recovery models, trauma-informed care, cultural humility, and advocacy. Students study substance use disorders, co-occurring conditions, prevention strategies, treatment approaches, and community-based recovery supports. Emphasis is placed on professional boundaries, client-centered practice, and real-world application. Supervised fieldwork allows students to apply their learning in treatment and recovery settings with appropriate support.



WHAT YOU CAN DO

Graduates of the Addiction & Recovery Pathway are prepared for entry-level positions in a range of substance use and recovery-oriented settings, including substance use treatment programs, recovery support and peer services, community outreach and prevention programs, medication-assisted treatment (MAT) programs, residential recovery programs, case management and care coordination, nonprofit and advocacy organizations, correctional and reentry support programs. This pathway also provides a strong foundation for students pursuing further education in addiction counseling, behavioral health, social work, or related helping professions.
