#### **REFUND POLICY**

Registration fee refunds are granted only under the following circumstances:

- A student who officially withdraws from an extension class(es) prior to the first class meeting shall be eligible for a 100 percent refund. Also, a student is eligible for a 100-percent refund if an applicable class is canceled.
- After the respective class begins a 75-percent refund shall be made upon the request of the student if the student officially withdraws from the class prior to or on the 10-percent point of the scheduled hours of the class. Note: This rule is applicable regardless of the number of times the class meets or the number of hours the class is scheduled to meet.
- A 100-percent refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws from a contact hour class prior to the first day of class of the academic semester or term or if the college cancels the class. A 75-percent refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws from a contact hour class on or before the tenth calendar day of the class.
- Self-supporting classes are not eligible for refunds.

#### **CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDIT**

For occupational extension classes, Continuing Education Units (CEUs) are allowed. One CEU may be given for each 10 contact hours of participation in class.

### State Employees Credit Union Foundation Scholarships:

Thirty different students will receive \$500 scholarships to enroll in short-term workforce programs that lead to a state or industry-recognized credential such as Basic Law Enforcement, Emergency Medical Technician, Real Estate, Phlebotomy or Nurse Aide.

The funding is through the SECU's Bridge to Career scholarship program.

To qualify for the funding, students must be North Carolina residents who are unemployed – or underemployed – adults, military veterans or members of the National Guard.

### Short-Term Workforce Development Grant

Recipients must be a resident of North Carolina and enrolling in Workforce Continuing Education (WCE) pathways/ courses leading to a N.C. Workforce Credential identified as either Essential or Career level. These pathways may consist of a single WCE course or a series of courses.

#### **Golden Leaf**

The Golden LEAF Scholarship program, designed to help North Carolinians attend the state's community colleges, is funded through a grant from the Golden LEAF Foundation.

The scholarship can be used for tuition, books, fees, supplies, transportation and childcare related to attending classes during the 2024-25 academic year.



**Dental Assisting Part 1** 

Course Code: DEN-3300 • Course Hours: 250

This course is designed to teach you the necessary skills to become a Dental Assistant I in the State of N.C. Coursework includes instruction in general studies, biomedical sciences, dental sciences, clinical sciences, and clinical practice. Graduates may be eligible to sit for the Certified Dental Assistant (CDA) exam through the Dental Assisting National Board once all requirements are met, including, 3000 hours of chairside assisting.

Dental Assisting Part 2 Course Code: DEN-3300 Course Hours: 150

This continuation of Part 1 includes the completion of Part 1 coursework, prepares the student for success in the health-care field, and includes a clinical externship. Completion of Part 1 is required.

#### Medical Administration Assistant Program with Electronic Health Records Office Professional

Course Code: OST 3000 Course Hours: 260

In this career, individuals play an integral role in the daily operations of physician's offices and hospitals. Throughout this course, students will learn Healthcare Foundational Knowledge and Basic Science, Patient Care Coordination, Computer Fundamentals, Communication and Customer Service, Medical Laws and Ethics, Electronic Medical Records, and Career Success in Healthcare.

#### Medical Coding and Billing for Outpatient and Inpatient Services Part 1

Course Code: MED 3300 Course Hours: 326

This course will include healthcare information management, reimbursement methodologies, biomedical sciences and an introduction to coding. In addition to one-on-one support from experienced instructors during training and access to personalized graduate support, students receive e-books, industry codebooks and access to online references.

#### Medical Coding and Billing for Outpatient and Inpatient

Services Part 2 Course Code: MED 3300 Course Hours: 329

This course is a continuation of Part 1 and will include legal compliance, CPT/HCPCS Coding, Advanced ICD-10 Coding, Advanced Anatomy & Physiology and Exam Prep.

#### Medical Transcription Editor Part I

This is the first course in a two-part program designed to teach the student to transfer audio-recorded dictation into hard copy medical documents. Online reference materials, student and technical support, and a one-year help hotline are included in this course offered by SCC in partnership with Career Step.

#### **Medical Transcription Editor Part II**

Course Code: OST 3000 Course Hours: 251

Prerequisite: Online Medical Transcription Editor Part I Complete the medical transcription editor program! This course is the second in a two-part program designed to teach the student to transfer audio-recorded dictation into hard copy medical documents. The student also will gain the knowledge and skills of speech recognition editing, which will help them produce medical documents that are used by physicians, medical personnel, and courts of law on a daily basis. Online reference materials, student and technical support, personal employment consultations, contracts and pricing guide, referral letters, résumé examples, and a one-year help hotline are included in this course offered by SCC in partnership with Career Step.

#### Pharmacy Technician Part I Course Code: PHM 3250

Course Hours: 213

This course prepares a student to find employment (and success) as a pharmacy technician in the health care or retail setting. Emphasis is placed on a variety of duties within the pharmacy environment including: computer fundamentals, basic anatomy, pharmacology, pharmacy law, regulations and standards, pharmacy calculations and prescriptions.

#### **Pharmacy Technician Part II**

#### NORTH CAROLINA INSURANCE PRE-LICENSING

SCC offers a variety of Pre-Licensing classes that include: Life, Health, Medicare Supplement/Long Term Care, Property, Casualty, Personal Lines and Adjuster.

#### **NCDOI Policy**

Insurance producers obtaining their insurance license for the first time will be required to be fingerprinted prior to receiving their insurance license. The licenses that will be affected include: life, health, accident and sickness, property, and casualty.

#### PRE-LICENSING COURSES-Online (Asynchronous)

Online video pre-licensing classes are insurance preparation classes offered via the internet. During an asynchronous course, you can access your course in the comfort of your home and/or office and satisfy the requirements on your own schedule, so long as you meet the expected deadlines. Video streaming brings the instructor and materials to the student. Since the program is available 24 hours a day, you can access materials and study when it best suits your schedule. This is ideal for individuals who need a flexible schedule due to work or home obligations.

All the education material and instruction are available and completed online: the pre-licensing book, the Candidate Guide, the sectional quizzes and the pre-licensing class exam. Through video streaming, you can see a video tape of an insurance class and can review it as often as you like during the 30-day program. If you are unclear about a topic, you can go through it again, or contact one of the oncall instructors to answer your questions. You must have an email account, a computer with Microsoft Windows Media Player for viewing the video, Adobe Acrobat Reader for viewing the text, and broadband internet access.



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


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
