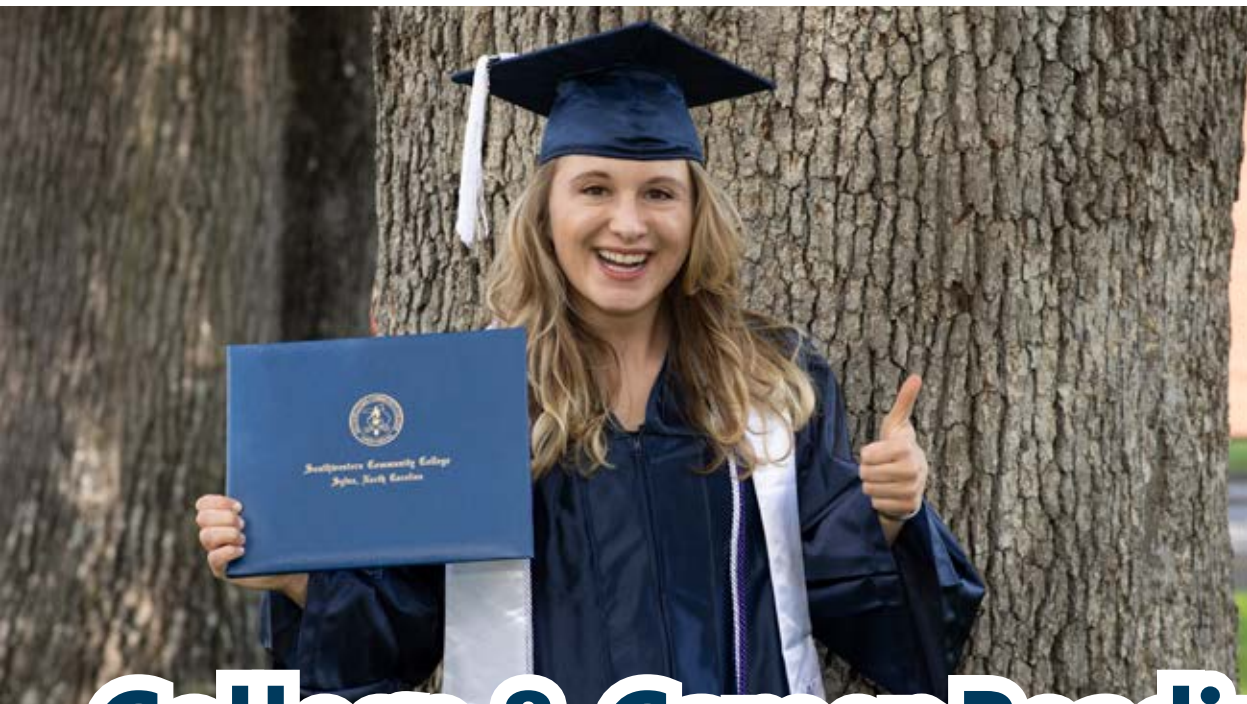

For the second and likely final time, Southwestern Community College is offering free tuition and fees to North Carolina residents who enroll in at least six hours this spring.

The “SCC Promise” program provides new students as well as those who’ve already enrolled with free tuition and fees so long as they:

- **Complete the 2021-22 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**
- **Enroll in a minimum of six (6) credit hours**
- **Complete the SCC Promise Application**
- **Are in-state residents**

The first day to register for Southwestern’s spring semester is Oct. 26.

“In the fall, a lot of students decided not to take a gap year simply because this is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity,” said Dr. Don Tomas, SCC President. “Anyone who’s thinking about waiting until the fall semester can save a lot of money by starting this spring.”

Free tuition and college fees are available for North Carolina residents for Fall 2021 and Spring 2022 only. This is a “last-option” financial assistance program that provides tuition after all other federal and state funds have been applied.

SCC will utilize various funding sources: The North Carolina Longleaf Commitment, the American Rescue Plan, Pell Grants (Title IV funds), Governor’s Emergency Education Relief (GEER) fund and scholarships as well as support from the SCC Foundation.

Anyone interested in more short-term training through SCC’s Career Academies can also get free tuition this fall through the GEER fund. More info at www.SouthwesternCC.edu/GEER.

For the first time, Southwestern Community College has been ranked among the Top 10 community colleges in the nation by two different ranking agencies in the same year.

OnlineSchoolsGuide.net has SCC at No. 7 in its listing of the "Top 10 Online Community Colleges for 2022." And BestColleges.com, which last year put SCC at No. 1, kept Southwestern among its Top 10 – at No. 6 this year.

These mark the third and fourth Top 10 national rankings under the leadership of current SCC President Dr. Don Tomas.

"I've said it for years because it's true: Southwestern receives this type of national recognition because our faculty and staff put students first, period," said Dr. Tomas, who stepped into his current role in 2011.

OnlineSchoolsGuide.net is the fourth ranking agency to place Southwestern in the Top 10 nationally. The college was ranked fourth (in 2007) and ninth (in 2010) by Washington Monthly, and WalletHub placed SCC at No. 7 in 2015.

In addition to the overall Top 10 rankings, two of SCC's academic programs recently received high national rankings as well. Earlier this semester, Southwestern's Medical Assisting program was ranked second in EduMed.org's listing of "Most Affordable Online Medical Assistant Programs."

And a year earlier, SCC's Cyber Crime Technology program landed at No. 2 in CyberDegrees.org's listing of the "Best Cybersecurity Schools for 2020."

"I can't imagine there are many colleges who've received high national rankings this

consistently," said Dr. Thom Brooks, Executive Vice President for Instruction & Student Services. "All of our alumni, current students, instructors, staff members – and everyone in the communities we serve – have even more reasons to be proud of what we're doing at Southwestern Community College."

Southwestern is the only community college in the nation to have a scientific partnership with NASA.

The college's Public Safety Training Center, located in Franklin, was the first in the U.S. to offer Park Ranger Law Enforcement Academy training for the National Park Service.

Southwestern is also the first and only community college in the state to offer an associate degree in Outdoor Leadership, and it launched the first Wilderness Therapy program in the nation from its Swain Center near Bryson City.

In cooperation with Harrah's Cherokee Casino Resort, SCC was the first college in North Carolina to offer table-gaming classes as part of a robust casino-preparation program.

SCC has served Jackson, Macon, Swain Counties and the Qualla Boundary since 1964. Among the college's 40 degree programs are 16 in healthcare fields, many of which are now offering instruction in the college's brand-new, \$22 million Health Sciences Center.

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Despite event cancelation, SCC gala raises more than \$80,000 to support student scholarships

Despite a pandemic-induced cancelation for the second straight year, Southwestern Community College's "Boots, Blue Jeans & Bling" gala raised more than \$80,000 to support student scholarships.

Originally scheduled for the second Saturday in September, the event was to be held at Harrah's Cherokee Casino Resort.

"It was extremely disappointing to cancel our gala again, but we have a remarkably loyal and generous group of supporters who believe in changing lives," said Dr. Don Tomas, SCC President. "The vast majority of our table sponsors told us to keep the money in support of our students. It really is quite humbling to realize we raised almost twice as much money for students this year as we did at our first gala (2014). On behalf of our students, we are extremely grateful to everyone who supports this effort."

The annual gala has raised more than \$530,000 since the inaugural event in Cashiers - including more than \$120,000 in combined donations the past two years that the pandemic has forced cancelations. All proceeds support students who might otherwise not be able to attend college.

"Next year, we are going to be back - and it's going to be a bigger and better gala than ever," said Wendy LeMay, who serves as the gala planning committee's co-chair along with Lambert Wilson - the chairman of SCC's Board of Trustees.

"We are deeply grateful to have a dedicated group of people who support us every single year, either through attending, volunteering, sponsoring tables or donating wine or silent auction items," Wilson added. "I

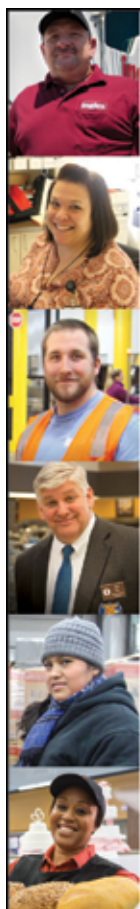
personally cannot wait until we can get together again in person."

Among this year's scholarship recipients is Andrew Eastep, a student in Southwestern's Physical Therapist Assistant program.

"This scholarship is wildly important for the continuation of my education," said Eastep, who received the Daniel May Finish Line Scholarship. "The pandemic brought financial insecurity and hardship, but this scholarship will ease the financial burden that comes along with studying for a new career."
