

Message from SCC's President

Nearly 55 years ago, our college's founding fathers constructed the first building on what would become the Jackson Campus. We will soon break ground on our 10th building, a state-of-the-art health sciences facility. Our goal is to equip this new facility with the latest medical equipment and technology to provide our students hands-on skills using exactly the same machines and devices they'll encounter their first day on the job. We also want to make sure every deserving student has the means to pursue a degree through our nationally acclaimed health sciences programs to address the critical shortage and acute demand for healthcare professionals.

In the first year following completion, the new health sciences facility will give 144 additional students the opportunity to enroll in one of our 14 healthcare programs. This new facility will also enable the addition of three new health science programs, potentially increasing health sciences enrollment to 288 in the third year.

It's important to note that the graduates of these programs can expect starting salaries significantly higher than the median poverty wage for both 2 and 4 person families. Nearly 90% of our graduates remain in western North Carolina, providing the region with well-trained healthcare professionals while stimulating the local economy through higher salaries.

That's where you come in. We hope you will consider investing in our region's future through the philanthropic prospects represented by our new facility.




