Articulation Agreement between Southwestern Community College (SCC) and Western Carolina University (WCU) for transfer of credit from the A.A.S. Early Childhood Associate degree at SCC into the Bachelors of Science in Birth-Kindergarten, Early Childhood Concentration degree at WCU.

- A. SCC students will be admitted as candidates for the articulation program in Birth-Kindergarten at WCU upon the completion of the A.A.S. Early Childhood Associate at SCC.
- B. To graduate from WCU with the Bachelor of Science degree in Birth-Kindergarten all students must complete the degree requirements per academic regulations listed in *The Record*, the WCU Undergraduate Catalog.
- C. Students wishing to graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree in Birth-Kindergarten must meet all residency requirements for graduation from WCU, which includes completion of the last 25% of course work to be taken at WCU.
- D. This agreement will run continually without need for renewal. Updates to the agreement will be initiated and processed every two years. The update process will be completed as follows: copies of this agreement will be distributed to deans and department heads by February 1 of each update year. Updates or "no change" approvals to this agreement should be returned by March 15. If curriculum changes are identified by either institution during the review process, parties from both institutions will review and approve the proposed changes and make necessary updates to the course equivalency outline.
- E. Either party upon written notice can terminate this agreement. If the agreement is terminated, SCC students who have matriculated at WCU can continue until completion of the baccalaureate degree if they are continuously enrolled at WCU. Also, students who are enrolled at SCC students at the time may continue under the terms of the agreement as long as they are continuously enrolled. If the student ceases enrollment for two regular academic semesters, he/she must re-enroll under the most recently adopted agreement.

Transfer Articulation Agreement Supplemental Advising Sheet

This is a supplement to the articulation agreement with WCU for advising students on the maximum number of courses that can be completed at SCC.

This agreement outlines the courses that will transfer from Southwestern Community College's <u>Associate of Applied Science in Early Childhood Education</u> to Western Carolina University's <u>Bachelor of Science in Birth-Kindergarten</u>. Utilizing this agreement will help you take the appropriate classes needed to transfer seamlessly from SCC to WCU.

To earn a bachelor's degree from WCU you must complete course requirements in three categories totaling 120 credit hours: Liberal studies (42 credit hours); Core courses (30 credit hours); Early Childhood Concentration Courses (30 credit hours) or Professional Education Concentration Courses (39 credit hours) and 9-18 credit hours of guided electives. A total of 74 credit hours can be completed at SCC with a minimum of 40 credit hours required to be completed at WCU. Students earning the maximum number of credits at SCC as outlined in this agreement should be able to complete the remaining coursework at WCU within five semesters.

You should meet with your advisor at SCC the first semester of your enrollment to ensure the appropriate courses are included in your schedule to transfer. The <u>deadline</u> to apply for admission to WCU for the fall semester is June 1; November 15 to enroll for the spring semester; and April 15 to enroll for the summer semester.
