Transfer Articulation Agreement Supplemental Advising Sheet

This is a supplement to the articulation agreement with WCU for advising students on the maximum number of courses that can be completed at SCC.

This agreement outlines the courses that will transfer from Southwestern Community College's [Associate of Applied Science in Culinary Arts](#) to Western Carolina University's [Bachelor of Science in Hospitality & Tourism](#). Utilizing this agreement will help you take the appropriate classes needed to transfer seamlessly from SCC to WCU.

To earn a bachelor's degree from WCU you must complete course requirements in three categories totaling 120 credit hours: Liberal studies (42 credit hours); Major requirements (54 credit hours); and General electives (24 credit hours). A total of 65 credit hours can be completed at SCC with 55 credit hours required to be completed at WCU. Students earning the maximum number of credits at SCC as outlined in this agreement should be able to complete the remaining coursework at WCU within four semesters.

You should meet with your advisor at SCC the first semester of your enrollment to ensure the appropriate courses are included in your schedule to transfer. The [deadline](#) to apply for admission to WCU for the fall semester is June 1; November 15 to enroll for the spring semester; and April 15 to enroll for the summer semester. I. [WCU Liberal Studies Requirement](#): 42 Credit hours are required (36 credit hours can be earned at SCC). The First Year Seminar (3 semester hours) is waived for students with 15.1 or more hours of transfer credit, and students do not have to make up the hours in the Liberal Studies program, but must have the total number of hours required by the program of the major to graduate.

TIPS FOR TRANSFERRING SUCCESSFULLY TO WCU

- 1) Meet with your SCC advisor the first semester of your enrollment to develop a course plan to ensure that you enroll in the appropriate classes to transfer to WCU.
- 2) Attend a WCU visitation with Student Support Services to talk with an admissions counselor, tour campus, and meet with an advisor in your intended major. Invitations will be sent via SCC email in the fall and spring semesters.
- 3) Submit your application for admission by the [established deadlines](#).
- 4) [Once accepted follow the Next Steps as outline by WCU which includes:](#)
 - a. Paying the tuition deposit by the required deadline;
 - b. Submitting immunization information by the required deadline;
 - c. Submitting your financial aid application by the WCU deadlines.
 - d. Attending the required [orientation](#) for transfer students.
- 5) Submit an official final transcript showing your most recently completed classes.
- 6) Utilize the WCU Advising Center to navigate the registration and enrollment process each semester.
- 7) Participate in Western's welcome dinner for transfer students and live on campus in the transfer student residence hall.
